Dept. of Commerce figures: In Oregon males number 103.2 to every 100 females — 53.8% live in urban areas as compared with 64% nationally — the population density is 15.8 per sq. mi. as compared with the national average of 50.7 — since 1953 the per capita has been lower than the national average, with the 1956 figure of 1908 being 98.4% of the national average and 82.6% of the average of Washington and California combined.
