Stanley and Dean Sisson, Karen Kent and Jackie Gervin and family were swimming at Harper Sunday.

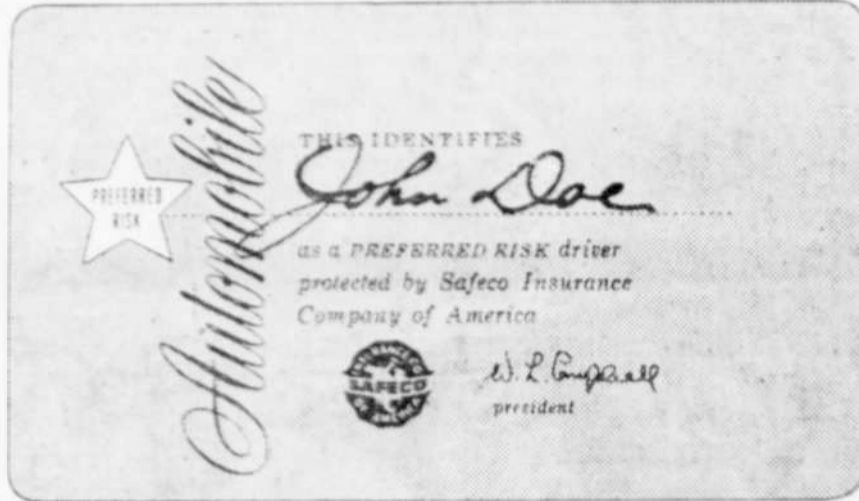
