MICHAEL EASTMAN'S RETURN HOME FOLLOWING VISIT

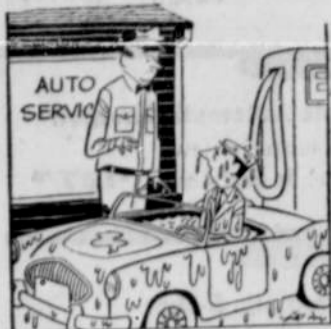
