J. Moss Scores High In OSC Mathematics Placement Tests

James D. Moss of Nyssa is one of 53 new freshmen at Oregon State college recognized for outstanding achievement in mathematics placement tests taken by some 1900 new students.

The 53 were the high scorers on advanced placement tests in trigonometry and algebra. Advanced placement tests were given to the 400 students who had the highest scores on the basic mathematics test.

They will, if they choose, be exempt from either one or two terms of freshman mathematics and will be assigned to advanced courses.

The placement tests, given as part of New Student Week activities prior to registration, help faculty advisers and students know for which classes or sections of classes the individual student is best prepared.

Names of the high scorers on the English and placement tests are released by OSC each year to emphasize the importance of the two subjects.



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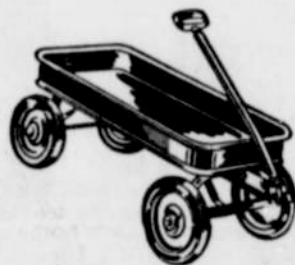
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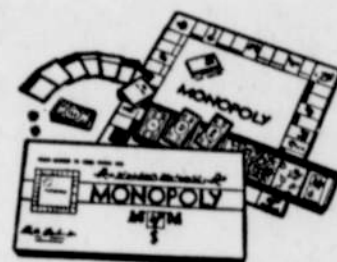
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
