Schweitzer's works on Bach and the organ, Jesus and Paul, science and the ethics of civilized man created storms of controversy but his works have become standard references for the musician, scientist, theologian and philosopher. In celebrating Schweitzer's birthday, the C of I acknowledges its dependence as an academic community upon the great minds of such scholars. Along this line the many facts of Schweitzer's studies will be taken up throughout the program.

The program will begin at 7:30 tonight in the Kirkpatrick Gym with Dr. Edwin Prince Booth of Boston U being the featured guest.

He will speak on "Albert Schweitzer—A Biography." Various seminars will be conducted on other Schweitzer studies by noted persons of the nearby areas.

Emma Anderson Jones Carlson, daughter of James and Sarah Anderson, was born October 22, 1890 at Montpelier, Bear Lake County, Idaho. She died at Malheur Memorial hospital in Nyssa, Thursday, December 31, following a short illness.

She was married to Albert Fanning Jones on June 2, 1911, who preceded her in death on August 3, 1937. On January 20, 1938 she was married to Verner B. Carlson.

Mrs. Carlson was active in church work and was secretary of the Primary association at the age of 15, and later second counselor of the relief society.

She is survived by her husband, Verner B. Carlson; two sons, Albert Eugene Jones of Grants Pass, Oregon and James R. L. Jones, Pocatello, Idaho; one adopted son, Mardell (Bob) Jones, address unknown and two sisters, Mrs. Martha Loftus of Ogden, Utah and Mrs. Sarah Mead of Colorado. Also surviving are six step-children and 11 grandchildren.

Services were held at 1 p.m. January 4 at the LDS Owyhee Ward Chapel, under the direction of Lienkaemper chapel, with Irene Patterson playing the prelude and postlude. Speakers for the service were Wayne L. Barrett and James A. Peterson, while the invocation was given by Leland Montgomery and Bishop Lee Stoker giving the obituary.

Final rites were held at Logan, Utah and interment was made by Hall Mortuary at Logan.

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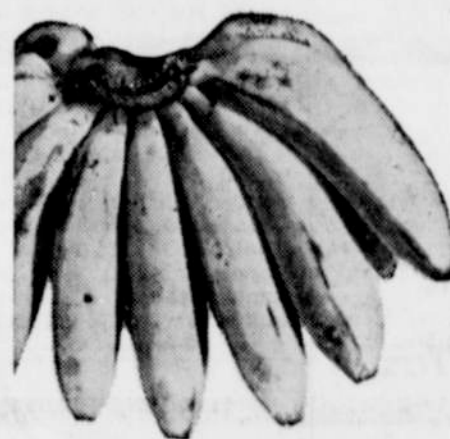
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
