Mrs. Larson is Hostess To Thursday Bridge Club

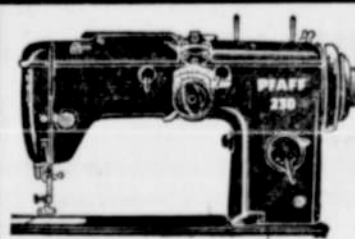
