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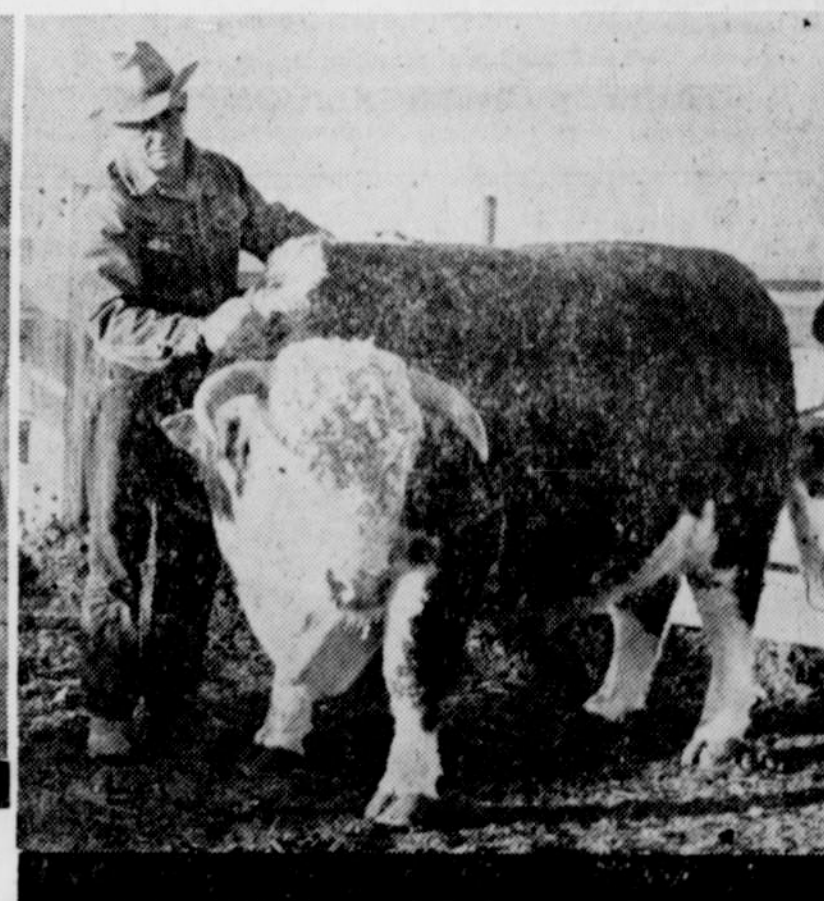

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That's the statement of Wayne Naugle who farms with his son near Nampa, Idaho.

On sugar beets and corn, Mr. Naugle broadcast 400 pounds of USS Ammonium Sulfate per acre, then added 140 pounds of Anhydrous Ammonia in the fall. Beet yields were 32 tons per acre, corn silage was 25 tons an acre. He also used a planned fertilization program on beans, grain, and potatoes with yields far above average.

Long an advocate of proper fertilization, Mr. Naugle experimented with nitrogen on pasture this year, fertilizing "university mix" grasses but leaving one strip unfertilized. "The fertilized area was waist-high at cutting time; the unfertilized strip was barely a foot high. Where we formerly harvested four bales, we got 15 by using USS Ammonium Sulfate," Mr. Naugle reported. Also, the protein content was far higher — important to a man who feeds quality cattle.

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
