

**Bulldog Receives Journalism Honor**

(From the Nyssa High Bulldog)  
For the third consecutive year the Nyssa Bulldog has been selected to receive the certificate of achievement from the Oregon Tuberculosis and Health association for a school press project. Judges of the Twenty-third Annual School Press project recently completed selected Nyssa as one of nine schools in Oregon to receive this honor. The nine entries from Nyssa, Lebanon, Beaverton, Tigard, Portland, Troutdale, Camas Valley and two from Salem have been forwarded to the National Tuberculosis association in New York for competition on the national level for the certificate of honor from Columbia university. To enter a press project the schools conducted a tuberculosis campaign through their school papers. All entries were judged for accuracy, originality, subject, research and journalistic style. Twenty-two schools submitted papers as entries. Nyssa was the only school in Eastern Oregon to receive this honor.

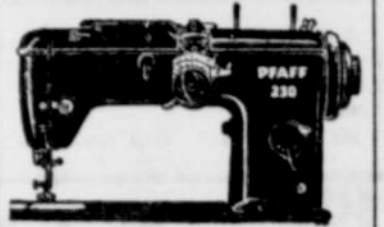
