Mr. and Mrs. Tom Eldredge spent Sunday in Boise at the Franklin Holsinger home where they attended a family birthday dinner.



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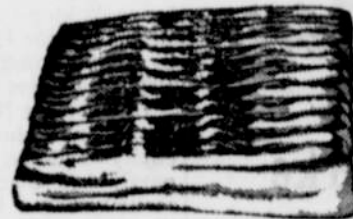
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
