Lewis Leaves Norfolk On USS Canberra

Thomas L. Lewis, fire control technician seaman, USN, son of Ray C. Lewis of Nyssa, departed Norfolk, Va., March 3 aboard the guided missile cruiser USS Canberra for a nine-month operational and good will cruise around the world.

The 13,000-ton man-of-war is enroute to San Diego, Calif., via Cuba and Panama.

It will be the first guided missile cruiser to operate in the Pacific area.

The Canberra and her crew are scheduled to return to Norfolk by next Thanksgiving.
