FHA Families Plan For Better Farming

Approximately 250 farm families, representing a portion of those using Farmers Home Administration credit in Malheur county, have completed a series of individual meetings with Harlan Heis, the agency's county supervisor, to review their 1959 operations and to make 1960 plans.

Heis said this year-end analysis is a service by the agency which makes loans to eligible farmers to operate, improve and enlarge family-type farms.

As a result of this study of their farm operations, Mr. Heis said, some of the better practices that farmers are working into their 1960 plans include crop and pasture fertilization, culling and testing of dairy herds and improved pasture management.

Farm families in Malheur county now using FHA credit include 189 with operating loans, 209 with farm ownership loans, 78 farm housing loans and 91 soil and water loans.

Good farm planning and record keeping are carried on throughout the year and play an important part in operations financed with FHA credit. During the past six months, 24 operating loan borrowers have paid their loans in full and are securing their necessary operating credit from local lenders.

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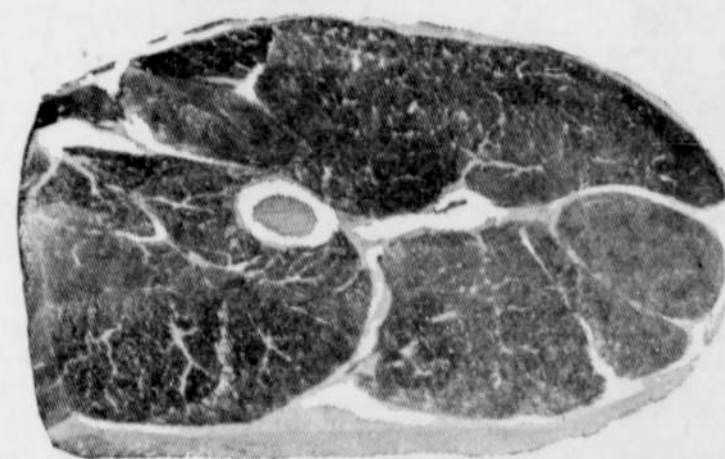
