Nyssa went scoreless until the top of the fifth when, with two away, pitcher Knute Stoneberg reached first on an error by the left fielder, Frank Walker followed behind him getting on through another error, Dub Jones singled them both in and then came on to score on a passed ball.

The Bulldogs tried for a comeback in the sixth which was to no avail as they brought in only one run and left one stranded, thus making the final tally 9-4 in Payette's favor as the two teams went scoreless the last stanza. Stoneberg went the distance on the mound for the Bulldogs, striking out six and walking the same number. Larry Bergman pitched 4 2/3 innings, striking out eight and walking four. Swanson came in as relief in the top of the fifth, issuing one free pass and three strikeouts.
