### LEGAL NOTICE

#### OWYHEE INSECTICIDE CONTROL AREA

Administrative Order No. 2

Relating to rules and regulations relating to the application of insecticides within the boundaries of the Owyhee Insecticide Control Area and the Restricted Area Malheur County, Oregon.

Pursuant to authority vested in the Owyhee Insecticide Control Area Committee by ORS chapter 573 and particularly ORS 573.535, the following order is promulgated:

**Section 1: Insecticides Which May Be Used.** During the period June 1st to and including August 31st of each year and for the purpose of protecting the Alkali Bee, only the following insecticides may be used in the Protected Area and the Restricted Area of the Owyhee Insecticide Control Area of Malheur County, Oregon: DDT, Kelthane, Dactone and Toxaphene. Such insecticides may only be used as follows:

(1) Application must be made when the wind velocity is less than five (5) miles per hour.

(2) Application must only be made prior to 7 a.m. or after 7 p.m. each day.

(3) Application must only be made in water carrier spray.

**Section 2: Permits Required for Use and Application.**

(1) Before any application of insecticides is made during the period set out in Section (1) above within the Protected or Restricted Area of the Owyhee Insecticide Control Area:

(a) The owner or the person in possession of land or property shall obtain and have a valid permit from the Owyhee Insecticide Control Area Committee.

(b) Any applicator (other than the owner or person in possession of land) shall obtain and have a valid permit from the Owyhee Insecticide Control Area Committee.

(2) The permits shall be issued for the period June 1st to and including August 31st of each year. Such permits expire on September 1st of the year in which they are issued.

(3) The permits may be repealed and revoked by a vote of at least three concurring members of the Owyhee Insecticide Control Area Committee at any time it finds there has been or is a violation of the provisions of law or the provisions of the rules of this order. The revoked or repealed permit may be reinstated by a vote of at least three concurring members of the committee.

(4) The permits shall be in the

possession of the person to whom they are issued or his authorized representative and shall be available for inspection at any time by the committee or its representative.

**Section 3: Rate of Insecticides.** The rate of insecticides applied shall not exceed those recommended and set out in the 1960 publication of the Oregon Insecticide Control Handbook authored and published by Oregon State College.

**Section 4: Special Provisions Relating to Onions Other Than Onions for Seed.**

(1) In addition to the insecticides set out and listed in Section (1) of this order, the use of Dieldrin will be permitted on onions for the control of Thrip, providing such insecticide is used and applied only in the following manner:

(a) Application shall only be made when the wind velocity is less than five (5) miles per hour.

(b) Application shall only be made in a water carrier.

(c) Application shall only be made by boom type ground equipment operating at a pressure at the boom of less than thirty-five (35) p.s.i. with the height of the boom not to exceed twenty (20) inches from the ground.

(d) The rate of Dieldrin shall not exceed one-half (1/2) pound parent material of Dieldrin per acre.

(2) To comply with the Federal Food and Drug law and regulations, Dieldrin shall not be applied to onions for green onion table stock nor shall it be applied during a period of 14 days prior to harvest on all other onions.

(3) Special permits will be considered by the committee for the method and use of Dieldrin by other types of equipment.

**Section 5: Exceptions to Provisions of This Order.** The provisions of this order do not apply to soil application and furrow treatments applied pre-planting by ground equipment, or to applications of insecticides made directly to fruit or shade trees, livestock, buildings, home gardens, or to shrubbery immediately adjacent to dwellings.

**Section 6: Emergency Permits.** Insecticides other than those set out and listed in Section (1) of this order or other methods of application may be used in emergency cases by a special permit issued by the committee to the applicator and to the owner or person in possession of land within the Protected or Restricted Areas providing that such insecticides, their use and application are also approved by Oregon State College and the State Department of Agriculture.

This order shall be effective immediately after it is published as required by law. Postponement of such date could result in serious prejudice to the public interest and could seriously injure the Alkali Bees and the crops they pollinate.

#### OWYHEE INSECTICIDE ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER No. 1 Relating to the Creation of a Restricted Area in Malheur County, Oregon

Pursuant to authority vested in the Owyhee Insecticide Control Area by ORS chapter 573, the following order is promulgated:

Section (1). Except as provided by Section (2) of this order, there hereby is created as authorized by ORS chapter 573, a Restricted Area one airline mile beyond the outer boundaries of the presently existing Owyhee Insecticide Control Area, all located within Malheur County, Oregon.

Section (2). Property described as the SE 1/4 of S. 33 T. 20 S. R. 46 E is not a part of the Restricted Area described and created by Section (1) of this order.

This order shall be effective immediately upon publication. Postponement of such date could result in serious prejudice to the public interest and could seriously injure the Alkali Bees and the crops they pollinate.

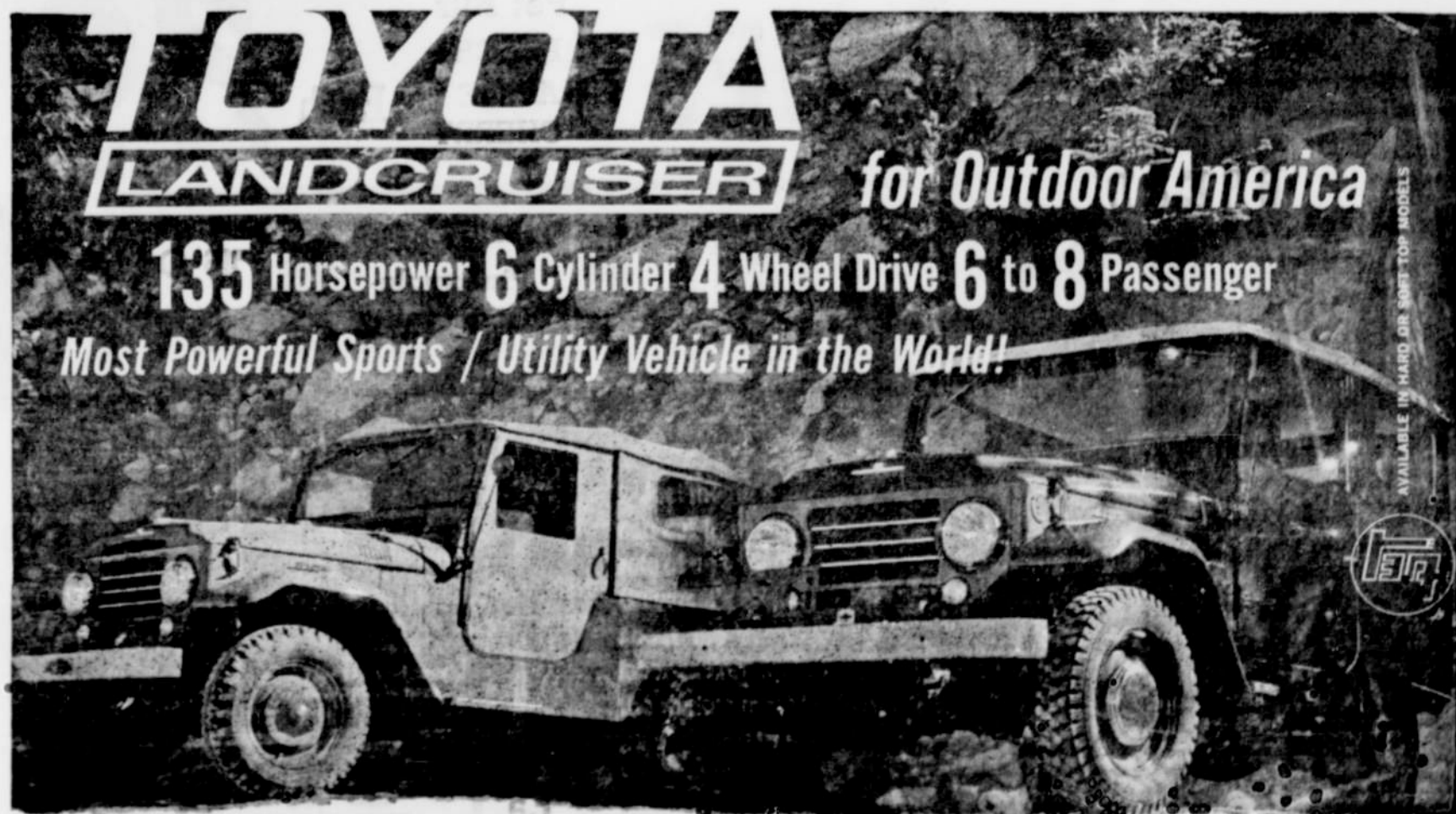
