Jean is bride-elect of Bill Welch, an employee at Amalgamated Sugar plant in Nyssa.

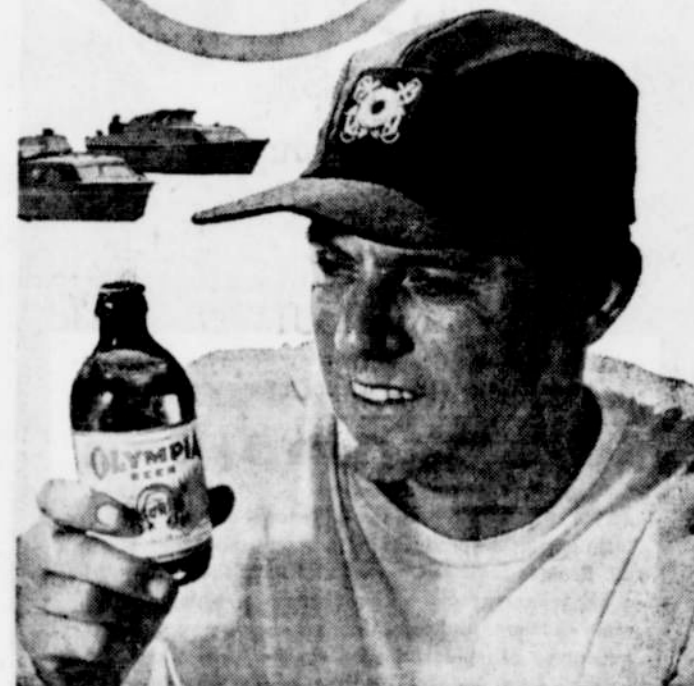
Warren Farmers Entertain Mr. and Mrs. Bridge Club
