

Traffic Hazards Pose Threat to Youngsters

An average of one child a week has been killed running into the path of a car in Oregon since the arrival of spring, according to the department of motor vehicles.

These deaths have moved the traffic safety division to warn parents and motorists: "Don't let your own traffic alertness—or that of your children—take a vacation this summer."

A traffic safety official pointed out that summer can be even more dangerous than the school season because children can be encountered in streets anywhere at anytime, rather than within a school area.

"During school," he said, "drivers are more alert to school children and the children are more likely to remember their walking and bicycling responsibilities."
