Malheur Cattle Freed Of Calif. Quarantine

Cattle from Malheur and three other buffer counties (Wallowa, Grant and Union) can now move into California without a permit and scab treatment. Cattle from these counties, as well as anywhere else in Oregon, are still required to have a health certificate for movement into California.

Specialist Reveals Economy Hints For Home Laundry

Today's soap and detergent packages contain enough helpful information to save families as much as \$50 a year in washer repair bills, soap and the satisfaction of clean clothes. But the family laundress often does not take time to read them.

When Oregon families spend in the neighborhood of \$15 million a year for new laundry appliances, it would seem worthwhile to learn more about them, believes Bernice Strawn, Oregon State college extension specialist. She suggests they study appliance instruction books, use recommended cleaning products and read labels on packages before buying.

More automation in laundry equipment, new fabrics and fabric finishes and development of more specialized washing products have changed washing recommendations in the last few years.

Nine out of 10 household washing products on the market today are detergents—one in 10 are soaps. A few years ago only one shopper in 10 used detergents.

Miss Strawn has found in visits with homemakers around the state that many think of package information as just so much "soft soap." She says this may have been the case a few years ago but now labels on modern washing products list detailed instructions based on research.

Bombarded with advertising from many sources, the family laundress may think what applies to one product applies to another—and is disappointed when

OSC Ag Extension Service Program Picked for Award

Oregon is one of five states in the nation chosen to receive a special award for its statewide extension service program in agriculture.

Charles A. Henderson, Klamath county extension agent, will represent Oregon county agents and Oregon State college extension service in receiving the award for extension service's contributions to Oregon agriculture.

Gov. Mark O. Hatfield will present the award Sept. 21 at a luncheon in Portland honoring all Oregon county agents. The awards program and luncheon will be sponsored by the agriculture division of American Cyanamid company.

The recognition is also given for progress made by Oregon farmers in adopting scientific production methods in agriculture, said F. E. Price, dean of agriculture and director of extension at OSC.

A major purpose of extension service is to extend knowledge in agricultural production and marketing and in home economics to people of the state as such knowledge is developed through research by OSC agricultural experiment station and the U.S. department of agriculture.

Henderson was selected by Oregon county agents to represent them because of the outstanding record he has chalked up in the 37 years he has been Klamath county agent.

In 1955, the county honored him with a "Charlie Henderson day." Sponsored by the chamber of commerce, the day was dedicated to "the man most responsible for the tremendous advances in agriculture in the Klamath basin," marking 33 years of progress and a 10-fold increase in the county's agricultural economy.

F. L. Ballard, associate director of OSC extension service, said "no county agent in the history of county extension work in Oregon has influenced more cash farm income development than has C. A. Henderson."

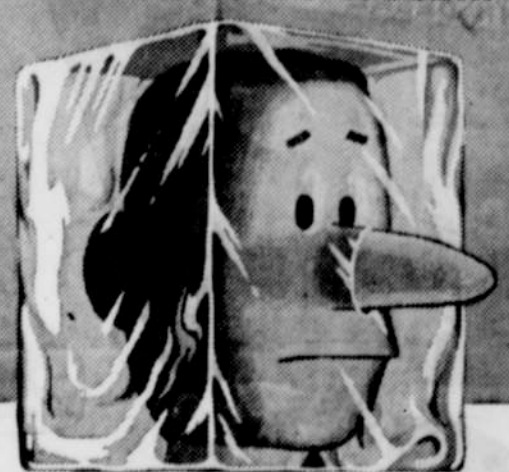
