Other individual winners were Patricia Dority, winning a hair dryer; Karen Saito, a fountain

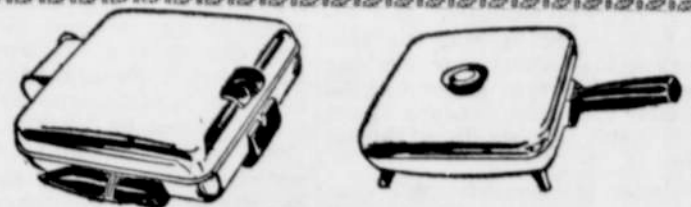
pen set; and Janis Burns who was awarded a miniature traveling kit.
