SWIMMING POOL CHARTER AMENDMENT SUBMITTED TO THE LEGAL VOTERS BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF NYSSA

"Shall the City of Nyssa charter be amended by adding a new chapter authorizing the construction and equipping of a public swimming pool, water heating and purifying system, a bathroom, and other related swimming pool facilities, within the City of Nyssa, including a site for said swimming pool, if necessary, authorizing issuance and sale of General Obligation Bonds of the City not exceeding \$60,000.00 to provide funds therefor, announcing pledging of all or part of the net revenues of said swimming pool and authorizing a tax levy in sufficient amount to pay principal and interest of said bonds whenever necessary to supplement available swimming pool revenues?"

Teresa and Carol are also members of the Happy Helper Sewing club.

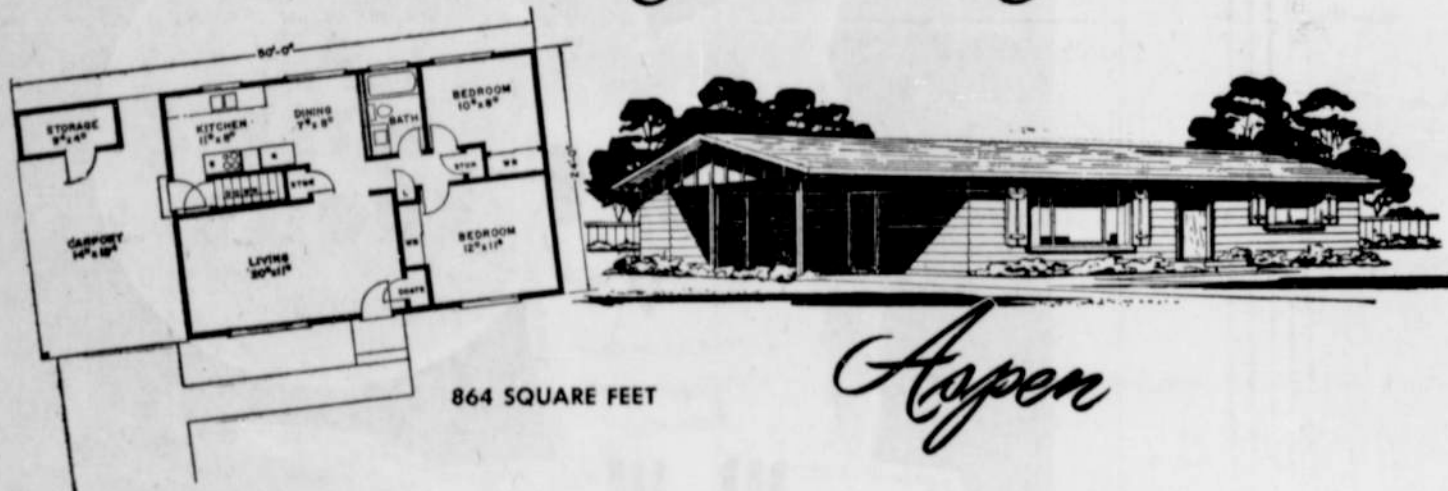

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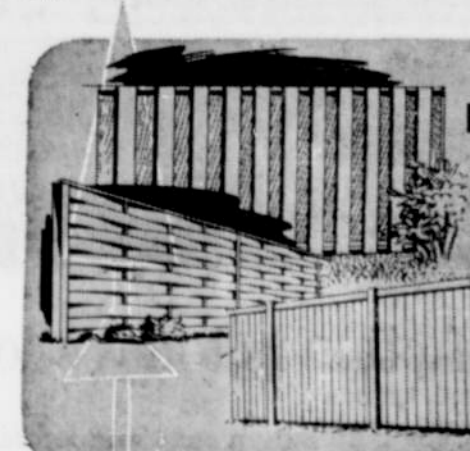
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
