while the other grades will remain about the same, McPartland said. The chamber endorsed SB 502, in its original form, and the secretary was requested to write local members of the legislature to this effect. 11. Guard his life against accidents.

**Group Views County Farm Labor Camps; Approval Expressed**

Businessmen, church and civic group leaders, farmers and other interested persons gained a first-hand picture of local farm labor camp facilities last Wednesday afternoon when nearly 40 persons turned out for a tour of farm labor camps. These camps are operated by the Malheur County Farm Labor Sponsoring association.

The touring group visited the Nyssa, Adrian, Vale and Ontario camps and inspected new construction and general improvements. Three pumice block apartment units are being added at the Nyssa and Vale camps and extensive improvements are nearing completion at all the camps under an annual improvement program.

Several persons attending the tour voiced approval of the camp conditions and housing facilities which are being made ready for some 1300 migrant workers who will begin arriving in Malheur county in numbers this week. The camps are operated by the labor sponsoring association comprised of over 400 local farmers who depend on migrant labor in the production and harvest of their crops.

Several church, civic and farm groups are also sponsoring programs to aid migrants and their families. Some need has been expressed for furnishing more playground and recreational equipment at some of the camps.

Thinning of sugar beets is expected to start around April 19.
