Nyssa Cindermen Take Track Honors At Malheur County Meet in Adrian

Setting five new records and accumulating 88 points, Nyssa's cindermen literally ran away with the Malheur county track meet Thursday, May 4, at Adrian. Placing second in the third annual meet, Ontario totaled 56. In third spot was Adrian with 30 and Vale took fourth with eight points.

Nyssa's new records came when Gilbert Lopez ran the mile in 5:05; Norman Baker, the 880 in 2:03; the 880 relay team, 1:37.7; the mile relay team, 3:48.8; and Frank Walker jumped 19-10½ in the broad jump.

Other records were set by Butch McDonald of Adrian in the 120-yard high hurdles with a time of 15.7 seconds, the 180-yard low hurdles in 21 flat and tied with Ron Pearson of Ontario in the high jump with a leap of 5-10.

Multiple winner for the Bulldogs was Mike Savage as he won the 100-yard dash in 10.3, the 440 in 54.8 and ran on the victorious 440 relay team.

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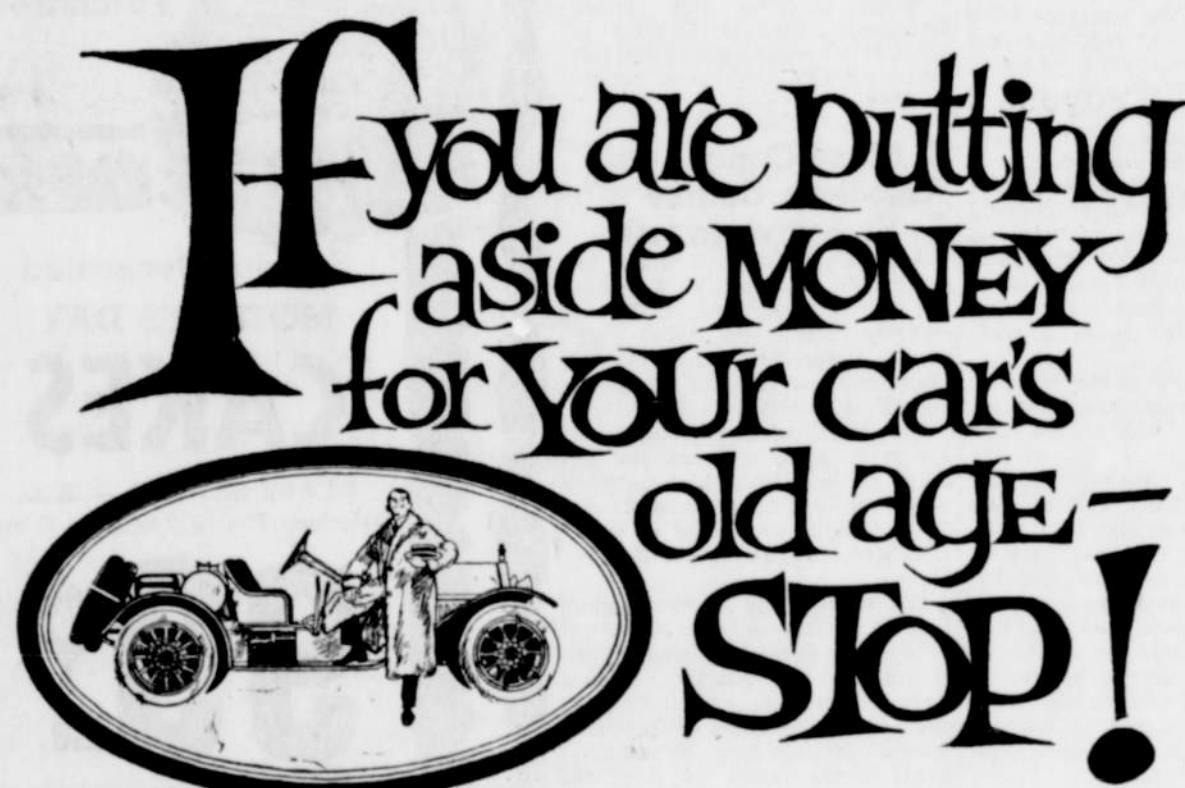
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
