Agriculture Department Announces Weights and Measures License Raise

New license fee schedule for scales and liquid meters goes into effect July 1, according to Walter Steele who is in charge of weights and measures for Oregon State Department of Agriculture.

Because of increased travel costs and depletion of weights and measures licence account reserve, license fees were adjusted upward by the 1961 legislature and a portion of the general tax funds was restored. This will enable the department to maintain its present high level of testing commercial scales and meters, Steele said.

Fees for scales are set according to capacity: 399 lbs. or less, \$1.50; 400 to 1199 lbs., \$3; 1200 to 7500 lbs., \$8; 7501 to 60,000 lbs., \$20; 60,001 lbs. or more, \$30.

Fees for liquid measuring devices are: retail fuel pump other than liquefied petroleum gas liquid meters, \$2.50; wholesale, bulk or vehicle tank fuel meters, size 2-inch or under, \$7.50; wholesale, bulk or vehicle tank fuel meters, size over 2-inch, \$15; liquefied petroleum gas liquid meters, size 2-inch or under, \$7.50; liquefied petroleum gas liquid meters, size over 2-inch, \$15.

Owners of each type of device will only be charged a fair and reasonable proportionate share of the cost of enforcement of the law. The department is required, after this year, to hold a public hearing before July 1 of each year to adjust fees up or down as necessary to maintain a reserve fund of not more than \$30,000. However, such adjustments may not exceed the maximum fees provided by the law. Fees for this year were set at the maximum as the reserve fund was too low to carry out the testing program for the coming year.

The amendment brings liquid petroleum gas liquid meters under the license law for the first time. It also requires authorization from the department for removal of repair notice tags in trade, meter and pump repairmen. It provides that scales not used in trade be tagged "not tested, licensed or approved for use in trade or commerce."
