

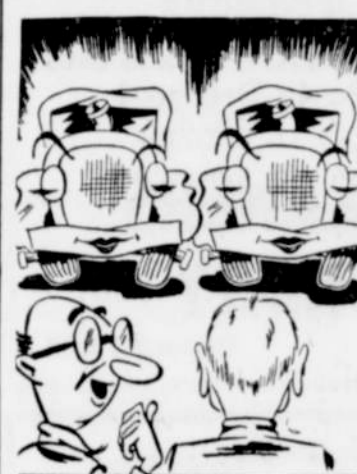

Refreshments of ice cream and birthday cake were served to the guests.

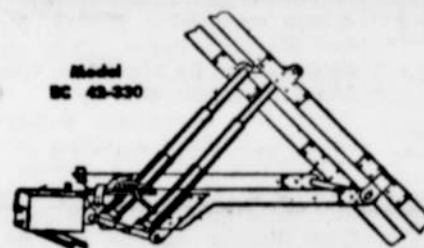
