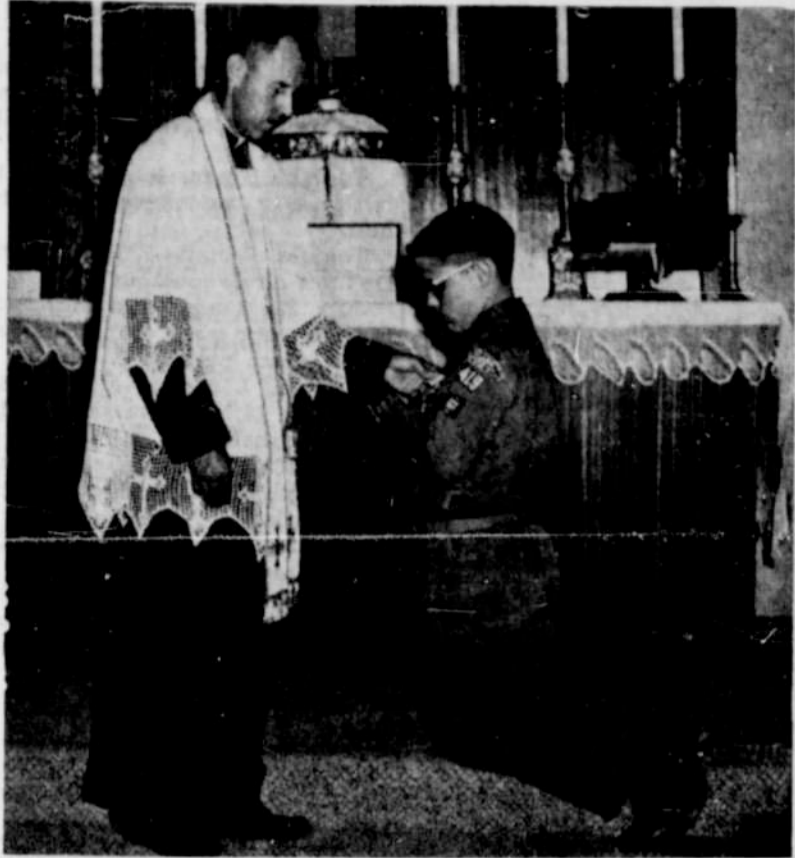


Presents Boy Scout Award

McCrary Graduates At Naval Air School In Pensacola, Florida

Principles and theory of flight, navigation, aerology, communications and officer indoctrination are basic subjects offered at the Naval School of Pre-Flight.

Graduated June 30 from the school at Naval Air Station, Pensacola, Fla., was Marine Cadet Dennis E. McCrary, son of Mr. and Mrs. E. L. McCrary of 207 Ennis avenue, Nyssa.

The 16-week pre-flight and officer indoctrination course provides foundation for basic phases of pilot training. Here, students get their first chance to fly, after completing intensive ground and in-flight instruction.

After graduation students are transferred to the Saufley Field Naval Auxiliary Air Station at Pensacola for the second phase of training as naval aviators.

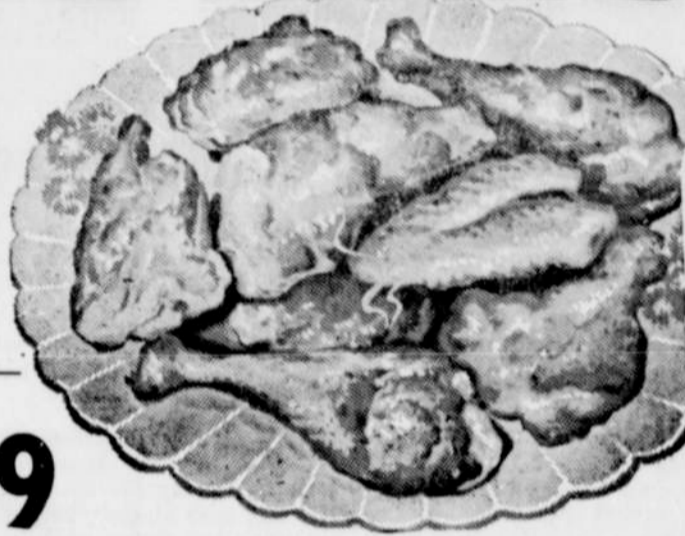
