Funeral services for James Austin Gilbert were conducted Monday morning, July 17, 1961, at United Presbyterian church in Adrian with the Rev. Gerard Kuiper officiating.

Mr. Gilbert was born Aug. 20, 1887, in southwestern Iowa and succumbed July 14, 1961, at Malheur Memorial hospital following a very brief illness.

He was raised on a farm and after completing his elementary education attended Tabor academy at Tabor, Iowa.

He was united in marriage to Eva Board on Oct. 30, 1912, at Raymond, S.D., and to this union four children were born.

Mr. Gilbert spent most of his life on farms in South Dakota and Iowa. He came to this area in 1952, spending some time in Nyssa and Vale, but having lived most of those nine years in Adrian. He was an elder of the Adrian Presbyterian church.
