June Traffic Claims 55 Lives; Half-Year Total Increases 30%

June 1961 went into the books as the worst June traffic toll in Oregon's history, according to Oregon Department of Motor Vehicles, when 55 deaths racked up last month surpassed the previous record June of 1946 when 46 persons died in highway crashes.

Nine of last month's smashups took two or more lives.

The dead ranged in age from a three-year-old boy, killed when he ran in front of a truck, to an 86-year-old woman who died when the vehicle in which she

was riding went out of control, careened down a steep bank and landed on a fence.

Twenty-six of those who died were under 30 years of age. One of these was a 17-year-old girl who died in the car she had received the previous day as a high school graduation present. She and at least six others were thrown from their cars at the time of impact.

The six-month toll stands at 229, slightly more than a 30 percent increase over the first six months of 1960. At the end of June 1959, the year Oregon broke all previous records for traffic deaths, the toll was 204.

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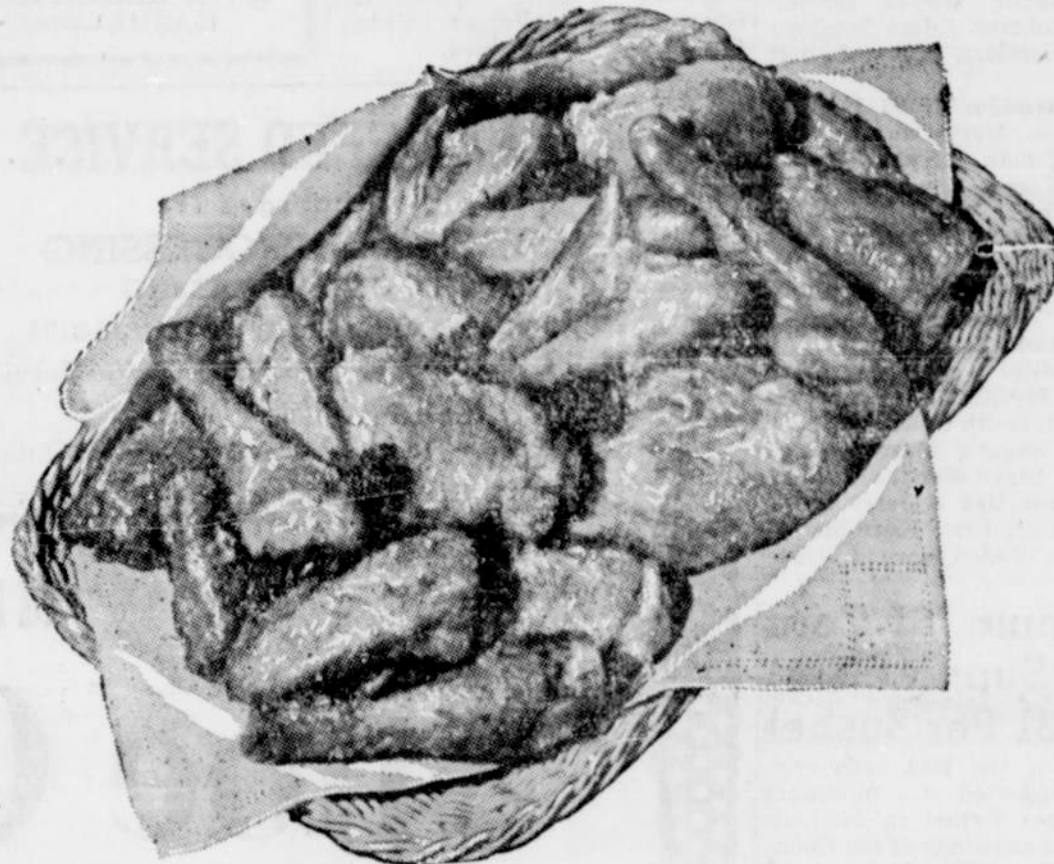
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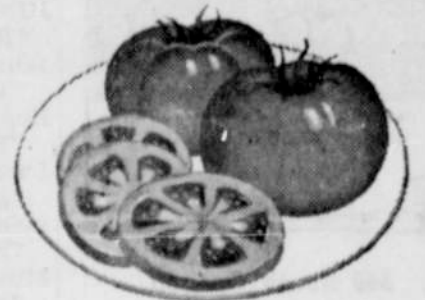
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
