

Sudden Death Claims Harry Henry Haney; Funeral Rites Friday

Funeral services for Harry Henry Haney will be conducted at 9:30 o'clock Friday morning, Aug. 11, 1961, at Lienkaemper chapel with Pastor John Briehl of Faith Lutheran church officiating.

Mr. Haney succumbed Aug. 8, 1961, at Owyhee corners. His body was discovered shortly after noon by Mrs. Edrie Blackford, owner of the Oasis cafe at the junction. He had been repairing a trailer at the rear of the cafe.

Death was attributed to natural causes. Results of an autopsy performed Wednesday afternoon were not available at press time.

Mr. Haney was born Feb. 28, 1895, in Nebraska, a son of Frank and Anna Haney. He was married Feb. 28, 1943, to Maude Stone. He had lived in this area for approximately 20 years, 17 of which were at Owyhee corners.

In addition to his widow of the home, survivors include one son, Chester Leo of Scottsbluff, Neb.; two sisters, Mrs. Lena Stevens of Gering, Neb., Mrs. Margaret Ross of Casper, Wyo., and two granddaughters.

Final services and interment will be made in Scottsbluff.

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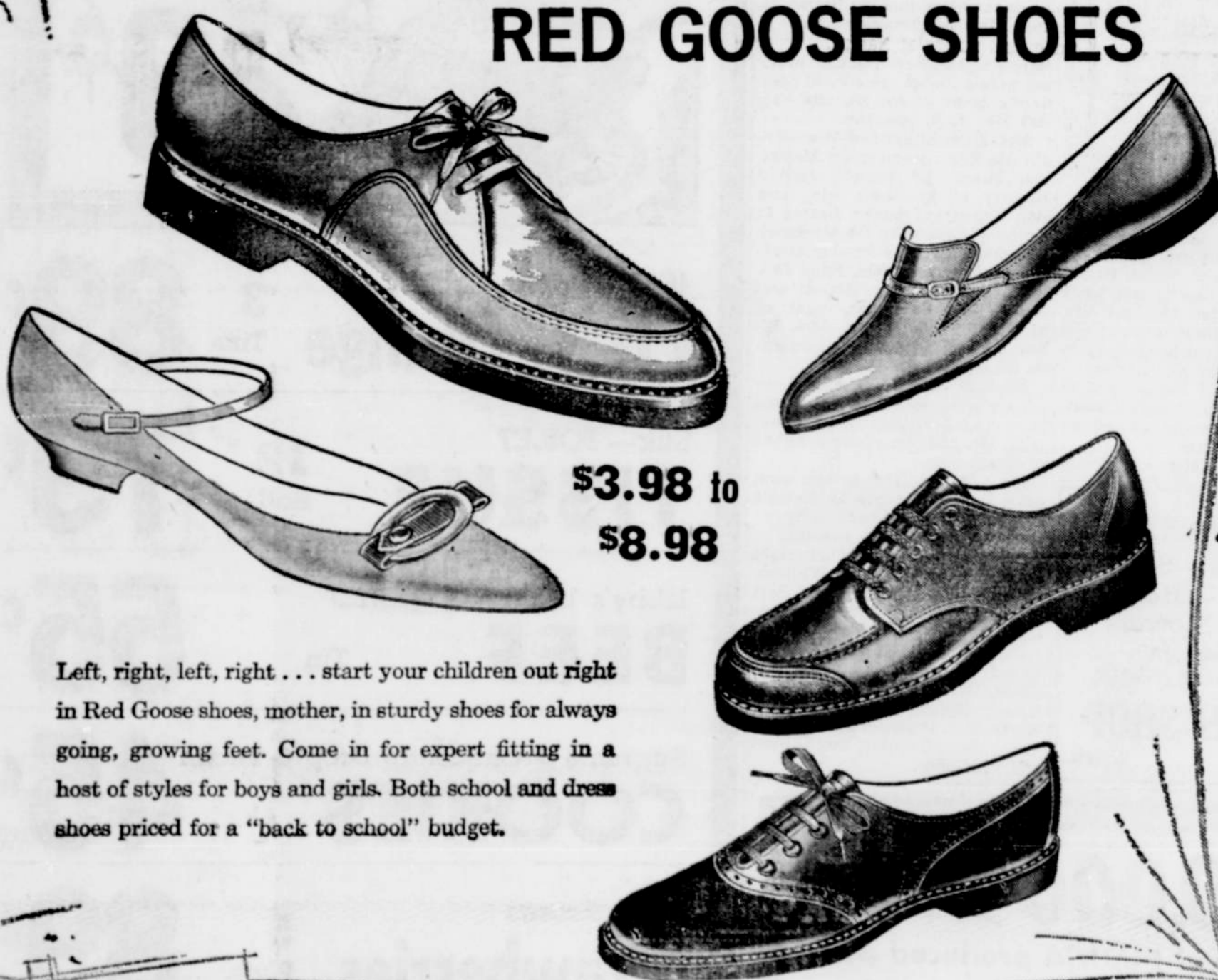
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
