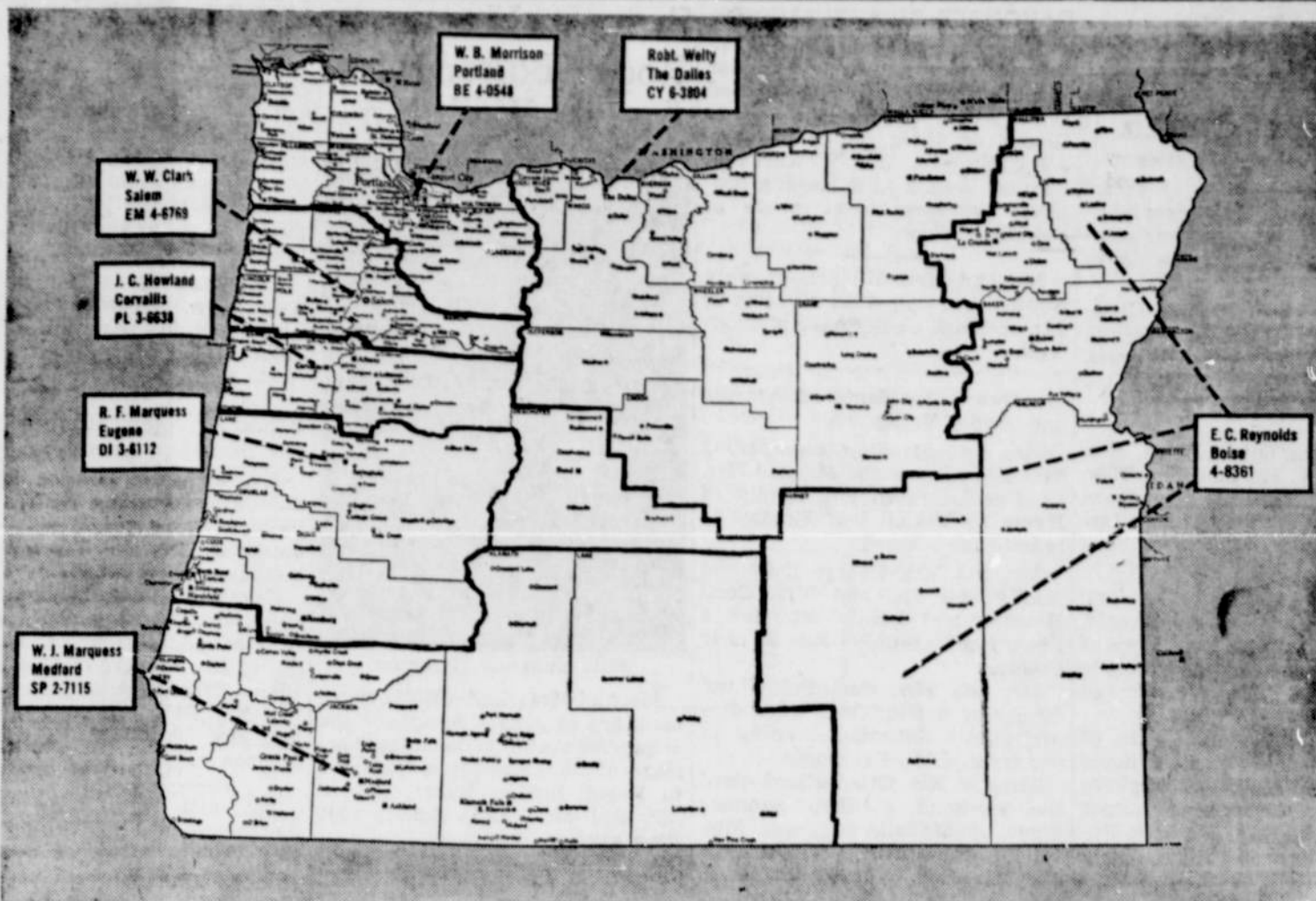
"The Great Adventure" by Pierce G. Fredericks. A step-by-step history of America's part in the European war.

Clip This New Map for Use in Case of Public Disaster

The Consulting Engineers Association of Oregon has issued this new version of a state-wide public disaster map, showing new telephone numbers of disaster contact engineers in Oregon's seven districts. These engineers are members of CEAO's Public Disaster Committee, which was formed more than a year ago, following the explosion in downtown Roseburg. In event of disaster, such as fire, flood, earthquake, explosion or enemy attack, a call to the disaster contact engineer will bring immediate help to determine what buildings and utilities are safe, and for how long. This map should be saved for emergency use.

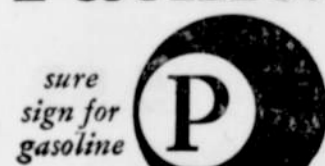
