MISS McPARTLAND WORKS FOR WELFARE COMMISSION

Barbara McPartland, daughter

of Mr. and Mrs. W. L. McPartland,

is one of eight college students

employed for three months by

Oregon State Public Welfare com-

mission in the student trainee

program.

Miss McPartland is a junior at

Willamette university. This is her

second year in the program and in

August she will have completed

six months' training. Following

graduation from the university,

this makes her eligible to apply

for a position of caseworker with

the agency or for a one-year edu-

cational leave grant to attend one

of 60 graduate schools of social

work in the United States.

The trainee program is designed

to recruit outstanding students to

the field of social work and is

open to college sophomores and

juniors. From five to eight posi-

tions are usually open each sum-

mer.
