'I Don't Want The Church... In Politics'

By Congressman Walter Judd

"I don't want the church working in politics. I don't want political action by ecclesiastical bodies. I do want political action by Christians. It isn't the job of the church to say what you should do. It is the job of the church to change men and send them into society as Christian missionaries and into politics to help change the government."

"The longer I am in politics the less confidence I have in the pronouncements by ecclesiastical bodies telling Congress what to do. Occasionally it seems to me that ministers would rather come down and testify or pass resolutions than they would to preach because it is more comforting. It gives them a sense of greater importance."
