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away from the tree. A spark from the train could ignite dry pine needles.

Check Lighting Sets

Use only electric lights to decorate the tree—never candles. Be sure to check lighting sets before placing them on the tree. Those with frayed wires should be discarded. When you buy a new set, look for the UL tag or label of Underwriters' Laboratories, Inc.

When you open presents on Christmas morning, put away gift wrappings you intend to keep. Gather up other wrappings and throw them away immediately after presents are opened.

The lights on Christmas trees should be turned off when everyone is away from home.

Check the tree for dryness from time to time. If needles near lights have started to turn brown, change position of the lights.

When the needles start falling, take the tree down immediately and discard it outdoors.

Even if the tree is still fresh, plan now to dismantle it the day after New Year's.

Make sure your decorative lighting does not overload electric circuits.

Wiring and electrical equipment used out of doors should be designed for the purpose.

New Books Enter Circulation Dec. 2 At County Library

New books going into circulation Saturday, Dec. 2, at Malheur county library include the following volumes:

"The Age of Reason Begins" by Will Durant. The seventh volume of "The Story of Civilization" series covers the years in England and the Continent from the mid-16th to the mid-17th centuries.

"Values and Ideals of American Youth" edited by Eli Ginzberg. A selection of 22 papers prepared for the 1960 White House conference on children and youth. The essays are grouped under three main headings: the development and adaptability of youth, problem areas for youth and values for youth.

"Betrayal at the UN" by De Witt Copp. This dramatically related chronicle explores the case of the late Paul Bang-Jensen, a Danish diplomat at the United Nations who refused to give his superiors a list of witnesses to the Hungarian uprising.

"Peace With Justice" by Dwight D. Eisenhower contains principal addresses by the former president in the last decade.

"The Lost Towns and Roads of America" by J. R. Humphreys. In pictures and story the author describes his trip from New Jersey to California by weather-beaten roads, telling of the past and of towns unchanged, and people who live today as their forefathers did.

"Bamboo Hospital" by Katherine L. Read. The story of a missionary family in Burma.

"Stroke" by Douglas Ritchie. A vivid account of the author's physical and psychological rehabilitation after a paralyzing stroke.

"The Conquest of Pain" by Ronald Woolmer. Recent as well as historic advances in anesthesiology.

"Poetry for Pleasure" by Hallmark Cards, Inc. A new collection of readable poetry in every kind of mood.

"The Horse America Made" by Louis Taylor. The story of the American saddle horse.

"Native to the Grain" by George Troy. The author of "Headland" again turns to a New England lo-
