At Auction Yards To further the state's brucellosis eradication program, the State Department of Agriculture has earmarked funds for testing of eligible dairy and beef cattle at

all auction yards. The test may be requested by the seller, the buyer or the auction yard. "In any case-the department picks up the tab," said J. W. Southworth, assistant di-

rector, in charge of livestock in**dustries** "Eligible" cattle are defined as all dairy or beef stock which have not been tested within a 30-day period previous to sale or are
