INVITATION FOR BIDS

The Malheur County Court will, at the Courtroom of said Court in the Courthouse, in the City of Vale, Oregon, at 10:00 a.m. on Monday, January 15, 1962, open bids for the following items:

Item 1. Crushed rock for surfacing and oil mat wearing surface.

Item 2. Construction of oil mat wearing surface.

General Conditions: All bids shall be in writing, delivered by the bidder or his agent to the County Court at the time and place above-stated. All such bids shall be then and there opened and read publicly. The uncrushed rock and gravel are in place on the premises and locations fixed by the County Court and which premises are available for inspection. The bidder shall be a qualified contractor with the State of Oregon. In awarding the contract, a Performance Bond will be required of the successful bidder. The work to be done under Item 1 shall be completed in its entirety before June 1, 1962. The work to be done under Item 2 shall be completed prior to September 1, 1962. Bidders may bid on either or both or a combination of said jobs. Bids for each job shall be specified separately. On combination bids the bidder shall indicate thereon whether or not he shall accept individual jobs. The County Court may reject any and all bids and reserve the right to accept the best bid without regard as to whether or not the same shall be the lowest bid.

Payments on Contract: Final payment on any contract shall not be made until the County Roadmaster has filed his certificate with the County Court stating that the work has been fully completed according to specifications and the terms of the contract complied with. Partial payments may be made upon any contract, not to exceed 85% of the value of the work done and material in place, upon filing with the County Court a 30 day certified progress estimate made by the County Roadmaster.

Deposit by Bidders: With every bid there shall be deposited with the County Court a certified check for 5% of the amount of the bid, which shall be forfeited to the County in case the award is made to the bidder and he fails for a period of 5 days after the award is made, to enter into a contract and file his bond.

Bond of Bidder: Every person, firm, company or corporation, before entering into a contract mentioned herein, shall execute and deliver to the County Court a good and sufficient bond in an amount equal to 50% of the contract price, conditioned upon the faithful performance of the contract according to the specifications and containing all other provisions required by law or the County Court.

Stockpiling: Before commencing any job the contractor and the County Roadmaster shall meet on the job, choose a suitable stockpile or site, level, measure and stake the exterior corners; all gravel to be stockpiled shall be piled thereon and payment shall be based upon the measurements of the gravel on the stockpile immediately following completion of the job. Reject materials, if any, shall be neatly stockpiled on the premises and remain the property of Malheur County.

Jobs are as follows:

Item 1: (a) Crushing 3/4" O Material; 21,000 cubic yards.

(b) Preparation of base, placing aggregate 10,000 cubic yards.

(c) Sprinkling; 50,000 gallons.

Item 2: (a) Sprinkling, blading and rolling;

(b) MC-2 Asphalt, 350 tons;

(c) MC-3 Asphalt, 355 tons;

(d) Placing and rolling aggregates, 9,400 cubic yards.

The work to be done consists of surfacing approximately 17 miles of the Owyhee Dam road from a point near the Owyhee River Siphon on the North Canal, Owyhee Project, to the Cherry Creek Resort on the Owyhee Reservoir.

Further information, if required, may be obtained from the Malheur County Court at Vale, Oregon.
