from the hospital Tuesday. He received a concussion and other injuries when he fell Sunday while ice skating.

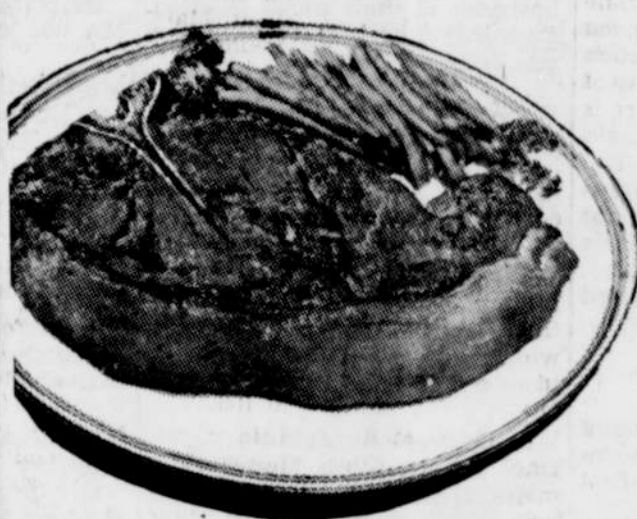
