NOTICE OF SPECIAL ELECTION OF THE RIDGEVIEW IRRIGATION DISTRICT

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN:

1. That a special election will be held in the Ridgeview Irrigation District, Malheur County, State of Oregon, on Monday, the 2nd day of April, 1962, for the purpose of determining whether the Board of Directors of the District shall be authorized for and on behalf of the District to enter into a rehabilitation, reconstruction and betterment repayment contract with the United States of America acting through the Secretary of the Interior, in pursuance of the provisions of the Federal Reclamation Laws, these being the Act of June 17, 1902, (32 Stat. 388) and all acts amendatory thereof or supplemental thereto, and with the Gem Irrigation District and the Owyhee Project South Board of Control.

2. The form of the contract proposed to be entered into is a draft of a rehabilitation, reconstruction and betterment repayment contract which has been approved in major detail by the Secretary of the Interior, subject to such modifications as appear desirable to the District's Board of Directors to conform to the requirements of the Secretary, the said Gem Irrigation District and said Owyhee Project South Board of Control as of the time the contract is prepared for signature. Copies of the form of said contract are available in the office of the District, and the form of said proposed contract appears in full attached to the minutes of the special meeting of the Board of Directors held on February 21, 1962, at which meeting the Board adopted a resolution approving the proposed repayment contract and called this special election. The form of the contract and the resolution of the Board of Directors approving the same are open to inspection by any elector of the District who is qualified to vote in this special election. The proposed rehabilitation, reconstruction and betterment repayment contract, when executed by the parties thereto, stated in general terms, will contain provisions relating to the following matters, among others:

(a) A description of the work to be performed in rehabilitation, reconstruction and betterment of the project works.

(b) Fixing the District's maximum repayment obligation for such rehabilitation, reconstruction and betterment work, in the maximum sum of \$40,520.00, exclusive of penalties and interest.

(c) Establishing the District's basic annual rehabilitation, reconstruction and betterment annual

installment charge of \$3,079.50, payable over a period of approximately fourteen (14) years without interest.

(d) Providing that the rehabilitation, reconstruction and betterment work be performed by the Owyhee Project South Board of Control, pursuant to applicable provisions of Federal Reclamation Laws.

3. That the proposed repayment contract will be executed by the President and Secretary of Ridgeview Irrigation District for and in the name of said District pursuant to the provisions of the resolution adopted by said Board of Directors on the 21st day of February, 1962, after the results of the special election have been determined, canvassed, and declared, if approval of said proposition is given by a majority or more of the qualified electors of the District who vote at the special election.

4. That for the purpose of said special election, the area within the District is hereby designated as being in one (1) election precinct and the polling place for said election precinct is hereby established as the Ridgeview Irrigation District office (formerly Ridgeview Schoolhouse) situated approximately 6 miles Northwest of Homedale, Idaho, in the SW 1/4 NW 1/4 of Section 25, Township 22 South, Range 46 E.W.M.

5. That the said special election shall be by ballot and proposition to be voted upon shall be as follows:

Proposition:
Shall the Board of Directors of the Ridgeview Irrigation District, Malheur County, Oregon, be authorized to negotiate and enter into a rehabilitation, reconstruction and betterment repayment contract with the United States of America, Gem Irrigation District and the Owyhee Project South Board of Control in conformity with the proposal specified in the notice of this election under the provisions of the Federal Reclamation Laws and of the laws of the State of Oregon, authorizing the District to enter into such contracts?
