House Census Shows Lack of Conveniences In Malheur County

Malheur county had 8,053 housing units, according to the 1960 census of housing. Of these only 5,464, about 65 percent, were in sound condition with all plumbing.

Over 15 percent of the houses were lacking hot and cold running water, while about 1800 had no bathtub or shower. Approximately 1900 homes didn't have flush toilets.

Although only one-eighth had air conditioning, over half had television sets, radios, telephones and washing machines.

There were 4,114 families with one automobile, 1,577 with two and 304 which operated three or more cars.
