

Baker of Ontario Tops State Record With Discus Throw; Nyssa Wins Meet

Nyssa won the annual Malheur county track meet in Ontario May 7, but Ontario's Terry Baker was in the spotlight with his 170-foot, 9-inch discus throw. The toss betters the existing Oregon state mark by more than five feet.

Mike Savage and Paige Zobel maintained their unbeaten strings in their respective specialties. Zobel hit 12 feet in the pole vault and Savage paced the quarter-milers with a 53.9 seconds clocking.

The Bulldogs finished the meet with 72 tallies and Ontario had 62½. Adrian was a distant third with 24½, while Vale trailed with 17.

Vale Vikings Advance to Sub-District Playoffs Via 8-7 Deciding Contest

Vale's Vikings edged Nyssa 8-7 to advance into the sub-district playoffs. The deciding contest was played on Vale's ground May 4.

The Vikings rocked Jim Kodama, the Bulldogs' starting pitcher, for four runs in the first inning. Julian Ceniga and Walt Scott

singled, Kodama walked Dan Johnson and Jerry Wilcox, and Ron Smith drove in a trio of Viks with his double to left.

Adding single runs in the third and fourth, Vale ran the score to 6-0. In the third Scott tripled to right center and romped home on Johnson's sacrifice fly. Smith led off with a single in the fourth. Advancing to second on Bill Rettig's walk, he scored on Ceniga's single.

Bulldogs Score in Fifth

Breaking the scoring ice in the fifth, the visiting squad pushed across two tallies when Don Arai singled and Terry Thompson was issued a walk. Both advanced on a wild pitch and scored when John Beck reached first on Johnson's infield error.

The Bulldogs grabbed a 7-6 lead in the sixth stanza. Pinch hitter Myron McCrady, pitcher Jim Kodama, Butch Bingman and Sid Lancaster walked, Arai smacked a sacrifice fly to left, Thompson singled, Maiden walked and Beck hit a sacrifice fly.

Vale knotted the score with a run in the seventh. Johnson gained life on an error, Wilcox walked and Smith singled home the tying run.

Wilcox Breaks Bat

In the eighth Wilcox blooped a broken bat single to left to score Ceniga, who had singled and advanced on Johnson's double.

Reliever Rod Chester collected the win. Mickey Dowers started, Johnson and Mel Hyland followed and then Dowers came in again. The four Viking hurlers surrendered five hits and struck out 10 Dogs.

George Jones was the losing pitcher. He replaced Kodama in the sixth and gave up the tie-breaking run. Combined, the pair allowed Vale 12 hits and fanned 10 Vikings.

The loss eliminated Nyssa from the race for the sub-district playoffs and a chance for a state playoff berth.
