At the meeting it was reported McPartland would attend a superintendents' legislative meeting June 19-20 in Eugene.

Leno Christensen will be in Nyssa today (Thursday) to make a survey of existing facilities and will meet with the school board and agricultural council this evening to review and discuss his findings.

The State Department of Education will conduct a complete study of all existing building facilities. The survey will help determine needs of future planning of school building facilities.
