The 23-year-old soldier is a 1956 graduate of Nyssa high school and attended the University of Oregon at Eugene.

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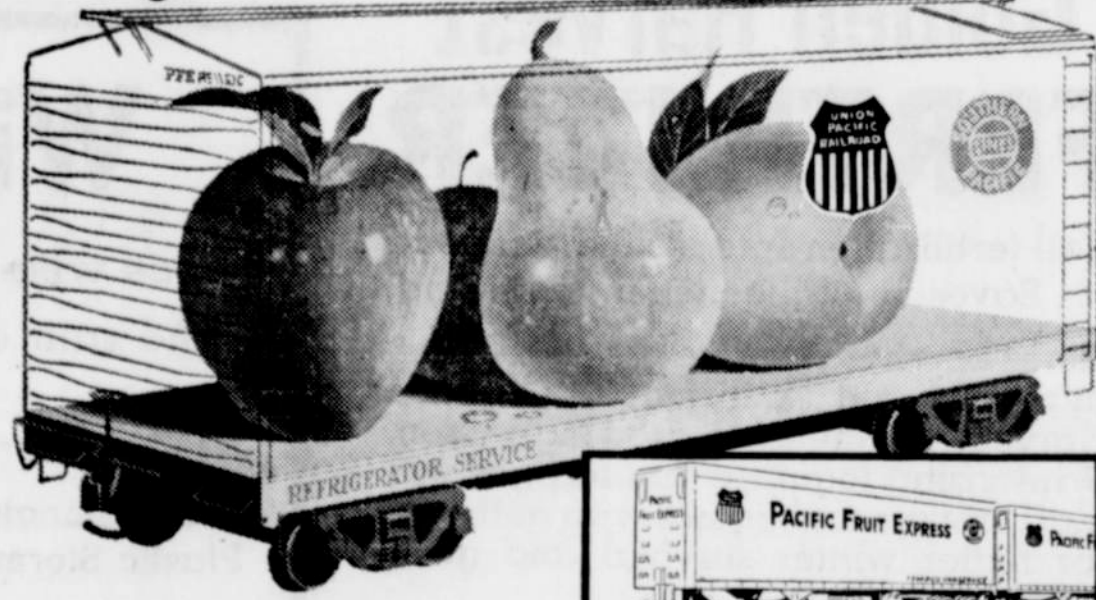
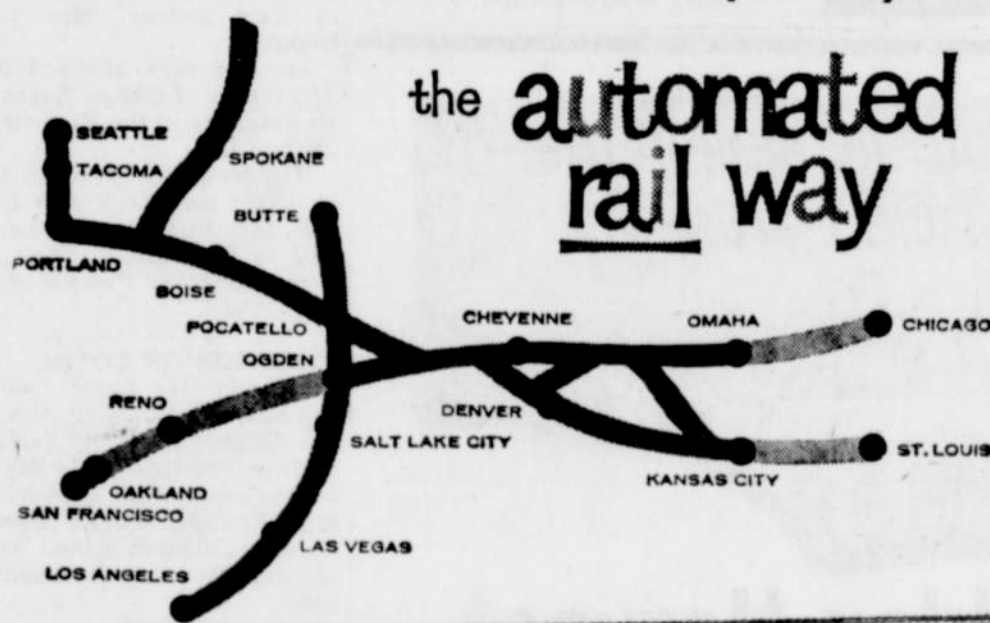
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
