



"I suppose then that I am really concerned with taxation and its burdensome, repressive effect upon the individual under the free private enterprise system."-Oct. 20, 1960.

"I believe that taxation upon the income of Oregon citizens is becoming confiscatory. Government should maintain services without increase in taxation. Government should practice economy within its agencies. A sales tax in Oregon is neither necessary nor economical. Should government need additional funds to maintain services it should come from luxuries such as tobacco or liquor. Government should exist upon the growth of the economy, not upon increased taxes." -Sept. 17, 1962.
