JACL Groups Slate Banquet in Caldwell

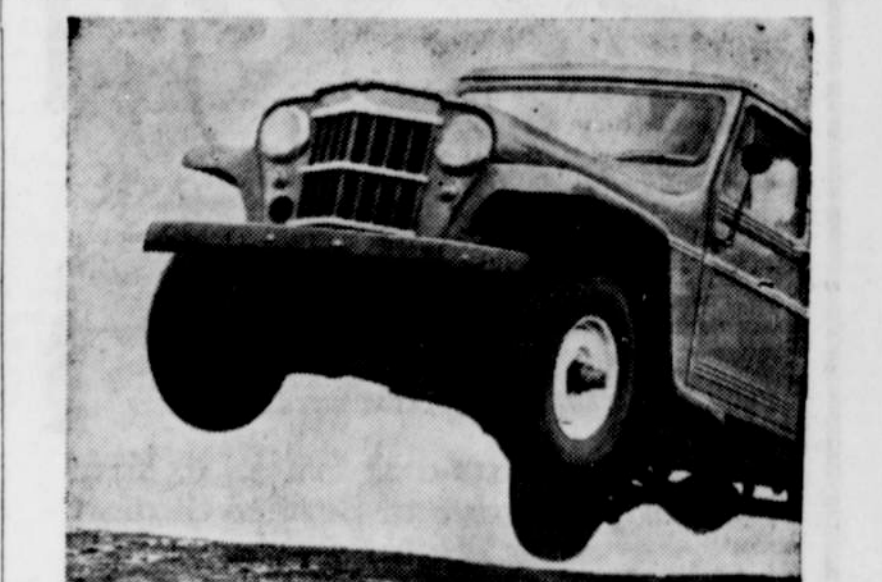
