Pasco Man Issued Spud Haul Permit

A Pasco, Wash., trucker recently was authorized by the Oregon state public utility commissioner to act as a contract carrier for Ore-Ida Foods, Inc., at Ontario, Ore.

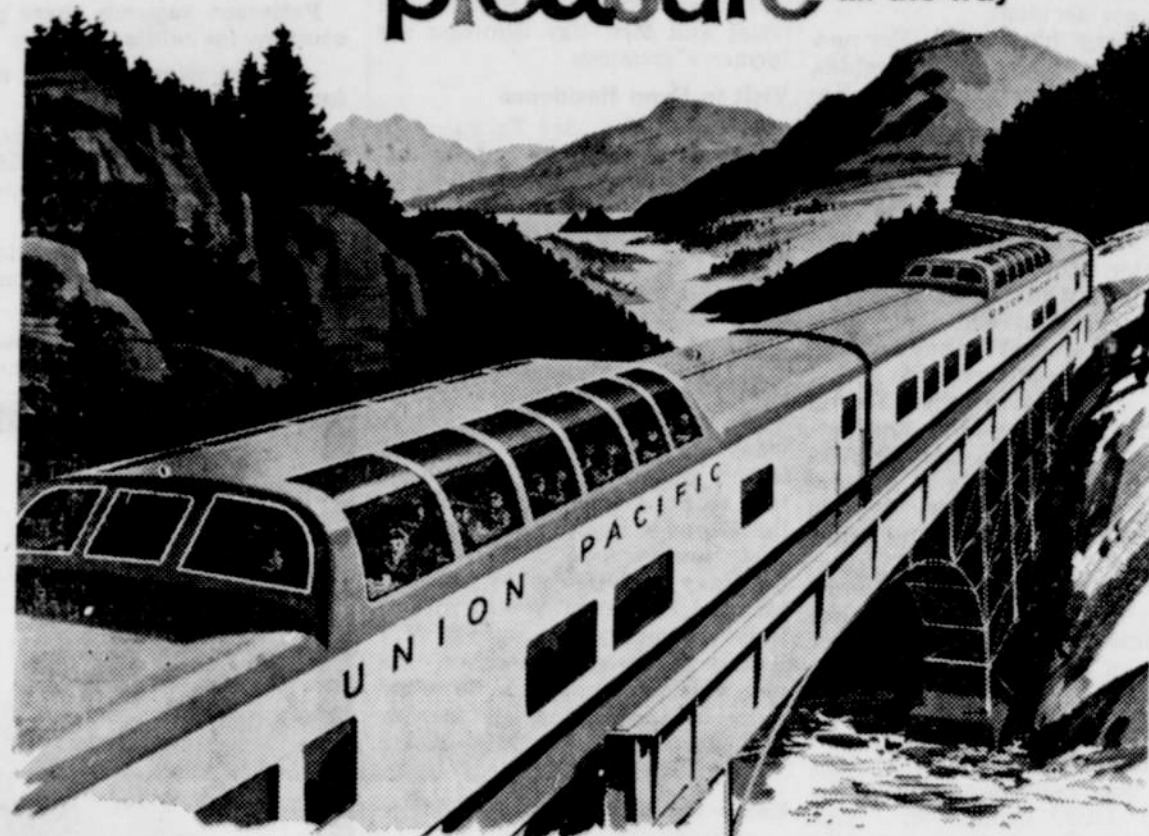
Commissioner Jonel C. Hill said Arnold J. Fricke, who lists Pasco as his headquarters, would be

permitted to haul potatoes from fields and storage plants within 100 miles of Ontario to the corporation's big processing plant in that city.

He said Fricke has especially designed equipment to transport potatoes without damage. Fricke's application was not protested by other carriers when the application was heard, the PUC reported.
