Vale Jaycees Hear Stunz Tell Beliefs Regarding Surpluses

While speaking to the Vale Jaycees Tuesday evening, Oct. 9, Rep. Emil Stunz praised them for their community efforts.

He also spoke of the ever-increasing cost of the state government and noted that in the past 10 years the budget expenditures have increased 82 percent in Oregon while population increase was only 15 percent for the period.

The representative said, "During my terms in the legislature, I have voted against many appropriation bills I felt we could not afford at that time and will work to curtail unnecessary expenditures wherever possible in the future."

"During the special session called by the governor in 1957 to decide what to do with a surplus of \$60 million, I held out, with others, for a 30 percent cut in state income tax against the proposal of 10 percent. We finally realized a 20 percent cut for the taxpayers in a compromise measure," Stunz added.

Stunz said he thought that any surpluses should remain with the taxpayers instead of being stockpiled at Salem.
