

Nyssa Rites Pending For Terry Jennings, Strangulation Victim

A 14-year-old boy was found dead at his home in Hubbard, Ore., Monday afternoon, a calf halter wrapped around his neck and anchored to a doorknob.

Police said Terry Jennings died of strangulation, but there appeared no signs of violence.

The boy was found by his brother, Jackie Lou, 12, upon returning home from school. Two other brothers, Mike, 16, and Russell, 9, also were in school.

The mother, Mrs. Pauline Jennings, said Terry did not attend school Monday because he had a touch of the flu over the weekend. He was a freshman at North Marion high school.

Mrs. Jennings was working in a Portland super market when notified.

Marion County Sheriff's Deputy Max Clay said the parents are separated and that the father, Robert, works in a Woodburn service station.

Police and the coroner's office are investigating the incident. Clay said suicide has been ruled out.—The Oregonian.

(The family is well-known in this area. Mrs. Jennings is a daughter of Mr. and Mrs. W. P. Hendricks of rural Nyssa and the boy's father, Robert (Arkie) Jennings, is a brother of Nyssan Earl Jennings.)
