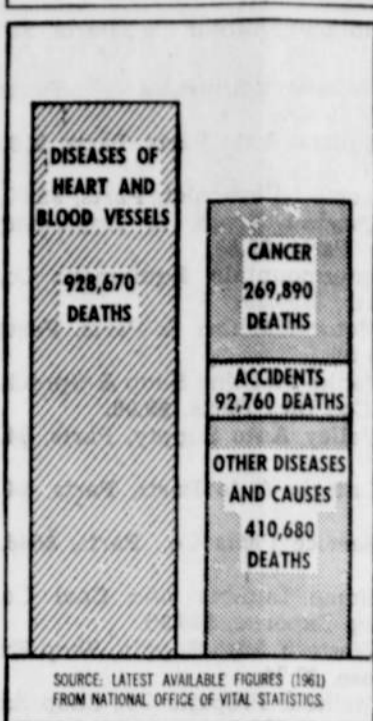
#### Celebrate Anniversary
