Tied for third and fourth places with 2343 pins were LaVern and Bernice Cleaver, Duane and JoAnn Holcomb; Jess and Norma Asumendi, Bert and Stella Ross. Each team received \$16.60.

Fifth place team winners were Sam and Dottie Parks, Clarence and Dorothy Clapp with 2333 pins and \$10.

Bowling Champion To Give Exhibition At Local Sugar Bowl

Steve Nagy, colorful bowling champion, will appear at the Sugar Bowl in a special bowling exhibitions at 4 and 8 p.m. Friday, March 8, it is announced by Mr. and Mrs. Bill Purcell of the Nyssa lanes.

Captain of the St. Louis Falstaffs when they shared in the 1958 and 1961 BPAA national match game championships, Nagy holds the 10-year ABC tournament high average, 208. In 1958 he rolled games of 244, 227 and 258 for a 729 series to lead the Falstaffs to the team title with a 3210 total, third highest in ABC history. He has received many other honors for his bowling achievements.

Nagy is one of the 140 of the nation's top tenpin performers who travel extensively to promote the sport through exhibitions and instruction sessions.
