Matmen Complete Wrestling Season At State Tourney

Coach Mel Calhoun took six wrestlers to the state meet in Corvallis over the weekend of March 1-2 and took a total of 12 points. The Nyssa wrestlers finished 16th in a meet that included 54 A-2 schools of the state.

Vale placed second in the state competition. The best A-2 school in the tournament was Canby.

Nyssa results were as follows: In the 98-pound division Ralph Carter was decisively won by Bill Rowland of Nestucca, who took the championship in that class.

Nyssa's 130-pound representative, Gene Jones, decided Karval Kilgore of Cascade in the first bout but lost to John Newswanger of McKinzie on a referee's decision in an overtime. McKinzie eventually took third place in the state.

Dority in the 136-pound class pinned his first man but lost to Jim Long of Philomath by a pin in his second match.

In the 178-pound class Chuck Corak lost to Larry Smith of Douglas by a fall. Smith went on to take second in his weight.

D. L. Fife at 191 pounds defeated Larry Johnson of Gold Beach by a fall but lost his second bout to Dick Potts of Canby in an overtime match.

In the heavyweight division Greg Duff defeated Dave Hassing of North Marion by a fall. In his second match he defeated a 300-pounder from Newport by the name of Donelson. In his third bout Greg lost to Mitch Lawson of Harrisburg who eventually took third place in the heavyweight division.
