Parma Services Held For Raymond Wilson, Retired Businessman

Services for Raymond Alvah Wilson, retired Parma merchant, were conducted Saturday morning, March 16, 1963, at Kirkpatrick Memorial Presbyterian church in Parma. The Rev. Wayne Wardwell was officiating minister.

Mr. Wilson was an uncle of Nyssans June Marie Wyckoff, Houston and Dick Wilson and Phillip Wilson of Weiser.

He succumbed on Wednesday, March 13, following a brief illness. The deceased was born in Brown's Grove, Ky., on Sept. 14,

1880, and went to Weiser in 1904. He was united in marriage June 5, 1907, to Lila Andrews.

He founded a grocery store in Ontario in 1910 and in 1919 went into the grocery business in Parma, retiring in 1944.

Mr. Wilson was a member of the Parma Presbyterian church, Masonic lodge and El Korah temple.

In addition to his widow, he is survived by one son, Joe R. of Mill Valley, Calif.; a brother, Barkley of Salem; two granddaughters, Mrs. Joan Lewis of Corvallis and Mrs. Roberta McFadden of Pullman, Wash. Three great-grandsons also survive.

Interment services were held at Parma cemetery under direction of Peckham-Dakan-Davis chapel.

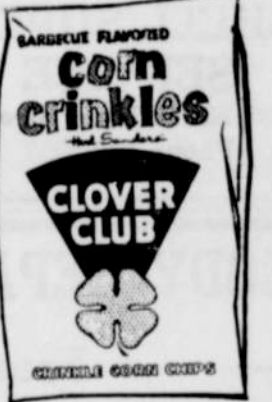
