The Ontario track team Friday handed back a little of the humiliation they've been suffering at the hands of Nyssa's thinclads for years and years. The Tigers scored 84 points to Nyssa's 51, Meridian's 24 and Vale's 18 to walk away with top honors in a four-way meet on the Nyssa track.

Nyssa took two first place honors by virtue of Jerry Hendricks' 23.9 seconds in the 220-yard dash and the win posted by the 440-yard relay team composed of Terry Thompson, Brent Schulthies, Doug Skeen and Hendricks.

Nyssa lads finished second in the high hurdles (Greg Duff), low hurdles (Schulthies), 880 relay, medley relay and broad jump (Schulthies).

Third place Nyssa wins went to Ralph Talbot in the 100 and 200-yard dashes, Mike Jefferies in the pole vault, Duff in the shot put and mile relay team.

Fourth place points were won by Mike Oft in the 880-yard run and Bob Glenn in the discus.
