Ontario, Emmett, Nyssa and Vale participated in an invitational four-team track meet April 4 in Vale and finished in that order. Ontario won with a point total of 64, trailed by Emmett with 50 points. Nyssa picked up 44 counters while Vale garnered 17 points.

Jerry Hendricks and Doug Skeen took second and third in the 100-yard dash. Hendricks also took second in the 220. Mike Jeffries took third in the 440-yard run, while Mike Oft took a third in the 880. Mike McGinnis came in fourth in the mile run and Brent Schulthies was fourth in the low hurdles.

Greg Duff and Schulthies placed third and fourth in the high hurdles. Nyssa's only first place in the track events was won in the 440-yard relay by Schulthies, Hendricks, Steve Kerby, Ralph Talbot. The Nyssa 880 relay team came in second, as did the team entered in the mile relay and medley relay.

In the field events, Schulthies took first in the broad jump with a leap of 18 feet, 10 inches. Duff took second in the shot put and Lawrence of Nyssa won the discus with a toss of 135 feet, 3 inches.
