Notice is hereby given that an election will be held in the Rural School District of Malheur County, State of Oregon from 2 p.m. to 8 p.m. on May 6, 1963. The purpose of the election is to submit to the legal voters of the rural school district the question of increasing the tax levy for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1963, over the amount limited by Section 11, Article XI of the Constitution. The reasons for increasing such levy are: Insufficient tax base to meet the provisions of ORS 334.270, which requires the Rural School District to levy a tax which shall equal amount of the Rural School Board's own budget plus an amount which is 50 percent of the estimated school tax levies for operating purposes.

The amount of tax, in excess of the six percent limitation proposed to be levied by the rural school district of Malheur County, Oregon, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1963, is \$29,741.50. Dated this 25th day of February, 1963.

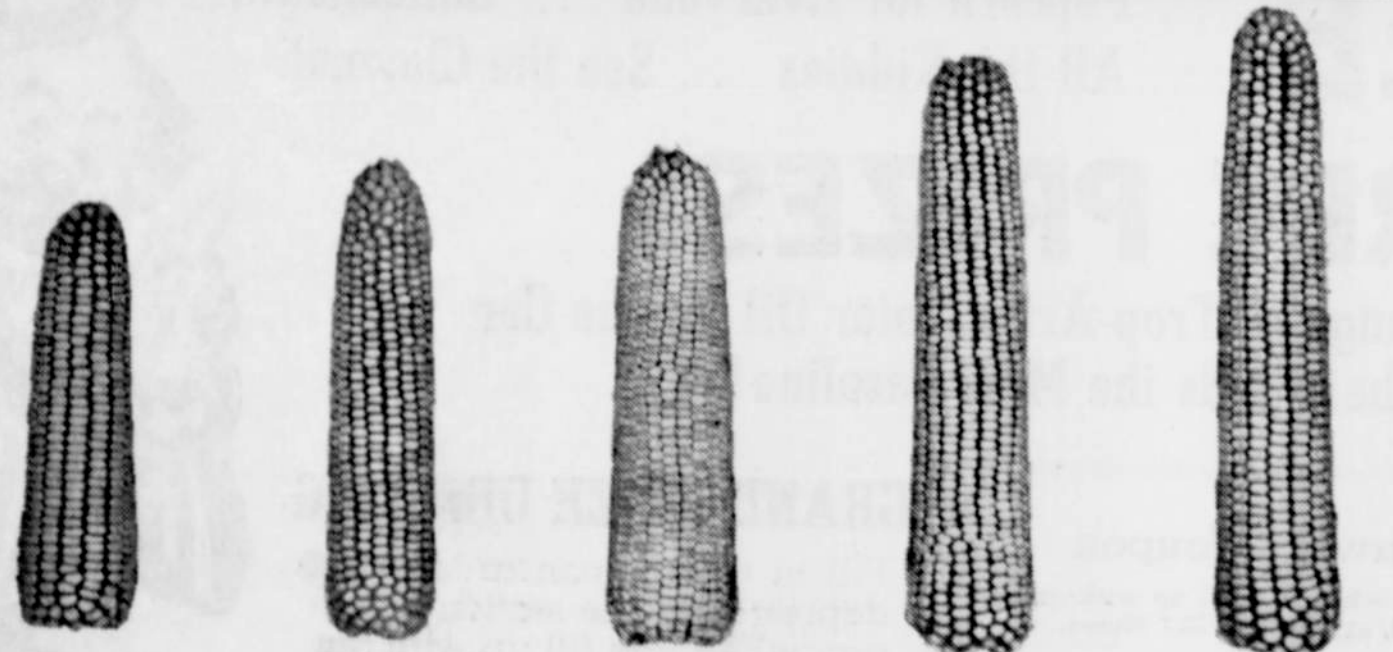
